

POETRY – HAIKU

Go to <http://totallyschool.com/thinglink.html> and copy (Ctrl C) the picture to thinglink (Ctrl V)

Then make tags. (Your links are below these instructions. You may also have some of your own that you want to add.)

- Go to Edit (to left of pix OR to the right of pix – either will work)
- Click somewhere on your picture and an icon will appear
 - You can change the icon by clicking on the icon in the pop-up
 - YOU decide what icons you want to use
 - I use the “?” if there is something they need to write or answer
 - You can move the icon where you want it if needed
- Copy (Ctrl C) and paste (Ctrl V) the link into the pop-up window
 - Type a short description OR
 - Type a question you want answered
 - If using video, I usually enter the time (just for me to know)
- Continue adding links
